PURPOSE OF THE OFFICE OF CAPITAL WRITS

The Office of Capital Writs ("OCW") was established by SB 1091 in the 81st Legislature, R.S. The OCW, which commenced operation on September 1, 2010, is a capital post-conviction state agency charged with representing death sentenced persons in their state post-conviction habeas corpus litigation and related proceedings. At the time of the filing of this LAR, the OCW is representing seventeen clients.

OVERVIEW OF OCW's FY 2014-15 LEGISLATIVE APPROPRIATIONS REQUEST

Since commencing operation in September 2010, the OCW had accepted all case appointments. That changed in July 2012 when the OCW turned down its first case based upon a temporary staffing shortage. Looking forward the OCW faces certain challenges.

The national average of capital post-conviction cases assigned is between four and six per attorney(Footnote 1). By July 2012, each OCW post-conviction attorney was handling an average of seven cases, above the national average. While the OCW expects its attorneys to handle a case load larger than the national average, the current appropriation level will force the OCW to decrease sooner the number of cases it accepts from the state-wide district courts. If this happens, the State could incur additional expenses based upon the appointment of private counsel rather than the OCW(Footnote 2).

To ensure that the OCW can accept all case appointments going forward (thus saving the State money and ensuring quality representation), the OCW should be funded at 2010 levels and the FTE cap should be increased for the 2014-15 biennium.

RESTORATION OF BUDGET AND INCREASE IN FTE CAP

A defendant in a state capital habeas proceeding has one final opportunity to raise issues of Constitutional dimension in order to establish his/her innocence or to show that he or she did not receive a fair trial. Most recently, the Texas Court of Criminal Appeals reiterated the importance of state habeas post-conviction litigation. See In re Hector Medina, 361 S.W.3d 633 (Tex. Crim. App. 2011).

In April, 2007, the State Bar of Texas Task Force Report on the creation of what was to become the OCW, recommended that "the office be supported with adequate funding that will allow the lawyers of the office to fully investigate all cases and to provide effective capital habeas representation to all clients." Throughout the Report, it was repeated that adequate funding is necessary for the representation of such clients and cases. The funding deemed appropriate by the 81st Legislature for the OCW's initial funding however has already been cut by over 11%(Footnote 3).

Due to the complicated nature of the cases brought to the OCW, expert witness fees and case-related travel are an integral part of the OCW's budget. To ensure that the OCW can continue to accept all case appointments in FY 2014-15, funding should be returned to 2010 levels and the OCW's FTE cap increased by four –adding two post-conviction attorneys, one investigator, and one legal support staff member. This request would result in an increase in OCW's FTE count from 9 to 11 in FY 2014 and from 11 to 13 in FY 2015.

OCW also requests the continuation of Unexpended Balance (U.B.) authority to provide the agency with greater flexibility in managing its scarce resources. The OCW was granted U.B. in the 82nd Legislative Session.

SUMMARY

The Office of Capital Writs provides an important function for the state—representing death sentenced indigent individuals in their post-conviction litigation.

At current funding levels, the OCW in FY 2014-15 will be forced to turn down case appointments, thus costing the State more money than it will save in the proposed budgetary reduction. Further, to ensure that the OCW can accept case appointments throughout the upcoming biennium, the agency's funding should be returned to 2010 levels (ultimately saving the State money) and increasing the FTE cap from nine to thirteen over the biennium.

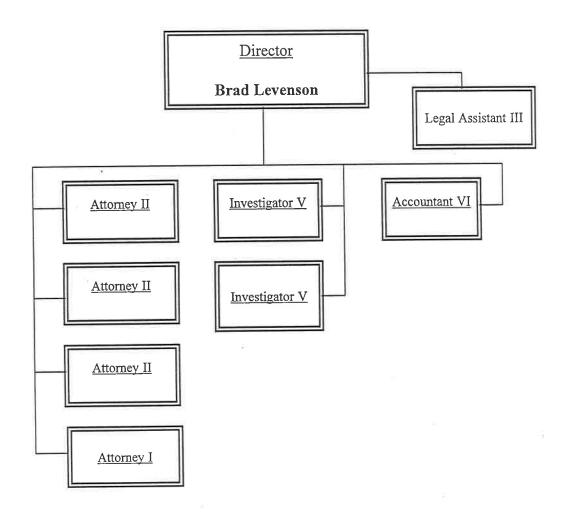

Footnotes

- (1) This number is based upon a review of case load requirements for capital post-conviction offices in various local, state, and federal jurisdictions.
- (2)Before the OCW's creation, the State paid private counsel up to \$25,000 for each case appointment.
- (3) The original amount appropriated by the Legislature for the OCW in FY 2010 was \$1,043,434. However, by the time the agency opened its doors on September 1, 2010, that amount had already been cut to \$991,262.

STATUTORY AUTHORITY: Tx Govt Code, Chapter 78

Under this strategy, the Office of Capital Writs ("OCW") provides representation to individuals seeking habeas relief in Texas death penalty cases. Due to the nature of cases brought to the OCW, investigative expenses and case-related travel are an important and integral part of the agency's budget. These expenses include, but are not limited to, the following: (1) travel and investigation to the scene(s) of the crime; (2) travel and investigatory interviews of family members and friends regarding the client's background and psycho-social history; and, (3) hiring and payment of expert witnesses. Without these services, the OCW cannot effectively represent its indigent clients. And without suffcient funding, OCW will not be able to accept appointment of all the State's cases, as originally anticipated.

EXTERNAL/INTERNAL FACTORS IMPACTING STRATEGY:

The funding for the Office of Capital Writs comes from the Fair Defense Account, a dedicated account in General Revenue. Its funding comes from court costs and fees collected by county and municipal courts and other revenues dedicated to indigent defense by statute. The vast majoirty of these fees are colleted from convicted criminal defendants.

Description/Justification for continuation of existing riders or proposed new rider

Any unexpended balances appropriated above in fiscal year 2014 are hereby appropriated to the Office of Capital Writs for fiscal year 2015 for the same purposes.

Investigation costs are a major component of this agency's budget. Uncertainty exists around these costs because they vary based on the particulars of the case being filed. In addition, payments for outside experts may not be billed in the year services begin. Authority to carry forward unexpended balances between years of the biennium provides greater flexibility in managing expenses that may vary greatly from year to year.

U.B. was given to the OCW by the 82nd Legislature, R.S. The OCW requests U.B. again in FY 2014-15.

DESCRIPTION / JUSTIFICATION:

This exceptional item would restore funding to FY 2010 levels, and increase the OCW's FTE cap to eleven in FY 2014 (one attorney and one investigator) and thirteen in FY 2015 (one attorney and one legal support staff member).

Due to the complicated nature of cases brought to the OCW, investigative expenses (including expert witness fees and case-related travel) are an integral part of the agency's budget. These expenses involve investigation and presentation of the following: crime scene/forensic evidence; evidence of the client's background and psycho-social history; and, evidence of the client's mental state including possible organic brain dysfunction and mental illness. Without the funding for these important services, the OCW will be forced to turn down new capital case appointments thus costing the State additional funding for the appointment of private counsel. To ensure that the OCW accepts all case appointments going forward (thus saving the State money and ensuring quality representation), the OCW should be funded at 2010 levels and the FTE cap should be raised by four over the 2014-15 biennium.

The restoration of the budgetary funding will benefit the State as the State would not have to expend money in the appointment of private counsel for those cases turned down by the OCW.

The funding for the OCW (and this exceptional item) comes from the Fair Defense Account, a dedicated account in General Revenue. Its funding comes from court costs and fees collected by county and municipal courts and other revenues dedicated to indigent defense by statute. The vast majority of these fees are collected from convicted criminal defendants.
